A Framework for Professional Development and Career Advancement in Early Childhood Education

All levels require Adult/Child/Infant in-person CPR and Pediatric First Aid if working in direct care.	
Membership	 Currently in high school or enrolled in HiSET/GED program AND currently working in Early Childhood (EC) setting OR Have not obtained high school diploma/GED/HiSET AND currently working in Early Childhood setting
Level 1	High school Diploma/GED/HiSET and currently working in EC setting
Level 2	 High school, GED, or HiSET and 60 hours of training plus 480 hours (3 months fulltime) employment in EC setting OR Some college with 6 EC credits, 480 hours employment in EC setting OR Associate's degree or higher with non EC major with 480 hours employment in EC setting
Level 3	 Current national Child Development Associate (CDA) credential with 1000 hours (6 months fulltime) employment in EC setting 0R Current National Association for Family Child Care (NAFCC) and 120 hours of training with 1000 hours employment in EC setting 0R Some college plus at least 12 EC credits and 1000 hours employment in EC setting 0R Degree with non EC major with no EC credits, 2000 hours (1 year fulltime) employment in EC setting 0R Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (MACTE) with no degree and 1000 hours employment in EC setting 0R High school with 120 training hours, 8000 hours (4 years fulltime) employment in EC setting
Level 4	 Current national CDA credential and 20+ EC credits plus 1000 hours employment in EC setting OR Current Montana Childcare Development Specialist Apprenticeship Certificate (college courses required) OR Degree with non EC major, 6 EC credits or 120 hours on training record, 2000 hours (1 year fulltime) employment in EC setting OR High School with 120 hours on training record, 10000 hours (5 years fulltime) employment in EC setting OR MACTE with degree plus 1000 hours employment in EC setting







Level 5	 Associate's degree with at least 20 credit hours in EC plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR One year 30 credit certificate in EC plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Bachelor's degree with 12+ EC credits plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR High School with 160 training hours plus 20000 (10 years fulltime) hours employment in EC setting
Level 6	 Bachelor's degree with at least 20 credit hours in EC plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Associate's degree in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting
Level 7	 Bachelor's degree with Associate's in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Bachelor's with minor in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting
Level 8	 Bachelor's degree in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Bachelor's degree in Education with P-3 endorsement plus 1000 hours working in EC setting
Level 9	 Master's degree in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Master's degree in related field with at least 20 credit hours in EC plus 1000 hours working in EC setting
Level 10	 Doctorate in ECE plus 1000 hours working in EC setting OR Doctorate in related field with at least 20 credit hours in EC plus 1000 hours working in EC setting

- The ECP staff will be available for continued support to help individuals obtain their GED or Hi-SET certification.
- If you have a High School Diploma or HiSET/GED but are having trouble locating this documentation please contact the Early Childhood Project.
- Early Childhood settings are programs offering services to young children and their families including administrative and teacher/caregiving roles, or programs that conduct training or education in early childhood.
- All college credits and degrees must be from regionally accredited colleges and universities.
- Early Childhood college courses (verified by ECP) count for annual training hours (1 semester credit=15 hours). Full-time employment based on hour requirement is considered 40 hours per week.
- Levels will be updated at time of renewal.
